Start with the Why

Are you raising money for a specific project or for general funds? This will help you decide on what type of fundraiser you should host.

Pro Tip: Share this goal often with potential donors to drive up donations during your fundraiser.

Form a Planning Committee

Your school's PTA/PTO is most likely juggling many different projects. You should take this time to determine who has the bandwidth to be a part of this fundraiser and clearly define responsibilities.

Pro Tip: Make a list of additional volunteers you can utilize such as parents and staff.

Use Your Fundraiser to Build School Spirit

A spirit wear sale is a great option to build school spirit and can be done multiple times throughout the year. Plan each fundraiser around upcoming school events or holidays to drive up sales.

Pro Tip: Create an online store and skip the bulk orders. <u>Booster Gear</u> only ships items that actually sell so you are never stuck with leftover inventory.

Plan a Promotion Strategy

From social media to signs and flyers, promoting your fundraiser is essential and will require even more volunteer hours. Create a timeline with how you will communicate with families and the community through the entire fundraiser.
